

Some new aspects of nuclear, biological and chemical terrorism

In the middle of the nineties of the past century, after the end of the cold war, there emerged a new security situation marked by the expansion of religiously motivated terrorism and the rise of apocalyptic groups threatening a new type of terrorism (super-terrorism), using weapons for mass destruction. With sober analysis of actual threats and the capacities of terrorists for such acts, professionals deal at present with this phenomenon with more rationality and recommend the most necessary measures for its prevention.
